The month of May begins with testing for our 3rd and 6th grade students, a teacher appreciation week, and a class trip for our 6th graders. The next week includes testing for

our 4th and 5th grade students, a
Kindergarten Circus, Preschool graduation,
and all of our enrichment classes conclude.
The final days of school include Field Days for
preschool and elementary, graduation for our
6th graders, and a final awards assembly.
After the last day with students, our staff
gather to make final preparations for closing
down for the summer.

We will take a week off at the end of May before starting our summer program on June 2. The summer program will run 8 weeks ending July 25. We are one of only a few programs in our community who offer summer programs for kids and we always end up serving some of our direct neighbors as well as other families in our community who need childcare.

God continues to bless the school ministry at Holy Trinity and our prayer is that He would help us stay focused on our mission of reaching out to children and families with the Gospel.





RECOGNIZING ONE OF OUR OWN

Sergeant Mark Heyungs, a member of Holy Trinity and employed by the Warren County Sherriff's Department, received the 2025 Legendary Partners Award on March 25. He was nominated for this award by the Barren River Area Child Advocacy Center (BRACAC) due to his work as a detective helping to solve crimes involving children as the victims. Heyungs was quoted in the Bowling Green Daily News as saying, "Of all the crime victims, it is the children who deserve the most attention and help... They don't have a full understanding of what has happened to them or why. I believe it is my responsibility to ensure they not only get the justice they deserve, but access to every possible service that we can provide." Sgt. Heyungs began working with the Warren County Sheriff's Office in 2021 and before that worked for the Army in the military police. Holy Trinity would like to thank Sgt. Heyungs for his service.
