### **A Personal Note**

As you read this, the season of Lent is upon us (possibly already begun, as of Ash Wednesday, March 5). This holy season has been set apart by the Christian Church for centuries in order to help us to remember and rejoice in our Savior's suffering and death for our salvation. Some things change in our sanctuary setting and in our worship during these days. The somber themes of Lent require some adjustments to our style.

One change shows up in the color of paraments, which will be purple (violet) during the weeks of Lent. Purple is the color of royalty and reminds us that Jesus has been elevated as King of the universe through His faithful obedience to the Father's will, even to the point of dying for us.

Another change is that the "alleluia's" go away during Lent. We typically do not sing hymns with "alleluia's" in them during this season. The "alleluia's" (and those canticles which use them) are omitted from use during Lenten worship. This is done to emphasize the penitent character of the season – and to prepare us for full-throated celebration on Easter as the "alleluia's" return to our worship life.

One other interesting "sidelight" is that the Sundays during Lent are identified as "Sundays in Lent" rather than "Sundays of Lent." The official 40 days of Lent (from Ash Wednesday to Holy Saturday) does not count Sundays. While the Sundays during Lent will often use Lenten hymns and liturgical chants, the themes of the Sundays are not built wholly on Lenten observance.

May this Lenten observance draw you to daily repentance, joyful reception of God's forgiveness, and eager service to others in the Spirit of Christ Himself, who came, not to be served, but to serve and to give His life as a ransom for all of us!

### **Smiths Grove Site Outreach**

Worship services continue each week at the Smiths Grove site (First Christian Church, 427 College Street). They take place each Saturday at 5 PM. Prior to worship, Bible study is held at 4 PM. Thanks to all of our Holy Trinity members who have attended and prayed and provided various means of support to this outreach ministry!

Please continue your prayers that this outreach would provide more open doors for the Gospel and that the Spirit will lead many to worship the risen Savior. With the opening of Buc-ee's at Smiths Grove recently (and the announcement of several hundred more homes going up in that neighborhood), there will be more people transitioning to this community. If you are living (or know someone who is living) in or around Smiths Grove, let us know so that we can contact them. Here is a church home where people know one another and love to serve the Lord Jesus!

### **Lenten Sermon Series**

You will recall the story of Jacob's son Joseph, sold into slavery by his brothers, eventually rising to be second in power to the Pharaoh in Egypt. When those hateful brothers were restored to Joseph after being confronted with God's working in Joseph's life, they feared final retribution from their younger brother. But Joseph said to them, "You meant evil against me, but God meant it for good." God meant it for good! That is an amazing confession of faith. That word will guide us as we think about some of the other evils that go on in our world (especially against the Savior in His suffering and death) – and how God means it for good, how He works to bring His purposes out of the worst of human wickedness.



#### THE LENTEN DESERT

During the Lenten season, which begins on Ash Wednesday, Christians figuratively follow Jesus into the desert. Just as our Savior spent 40 days fasting and facing temptation, we focus on self-reflection and contrition.

In an 1873 hymn, Claudia Hernaman wrote, "O Lord, throughout these forty days, you prayed and kept the fast. Inspire repentance for our sin, and free us from our past."

The desert experience of Lent serves a clear purpose, filling us up rather than depleting us. "This is what Lent is meant to be," writes theologian Ron Rolheiser. "Time in the desert to courageously face the chaos and the demons within us and to let God do battle with them through us. The result is that we are purified, made ready, so the intoxicating joy of Easter might then bind us more closely to God and each other."







### **Centered on Worship**

Holy Trinity Lutheran School has incorporated weekly chapel services since its inception. Chapel services are held each Wednesday at 8:30am and the entire student body, from 2-year-olds to 6th graders, gather together in the sanctuary to worship together. It is a service geared toward children and designed to involve them. This is the highlight of the week and the heart of who we are as a Lutheran school.

The opening and closing songs have been the same since before my time at HTLS and continue to be very important pieces to our worship. We begin with "The Light of Christ" as the candles are lit by one of our 4th grade students, followed by "Open our Eyes Lord". Our closing song is "The Gift of God", an oldy but a goody...based on Romans 6:23. We have classes take turns leading the actions to our closing song.

We have a 3rd grade student help by asking class representatives to "please bring their offerings to the Lord." (Chapel offering charities are selected by staff at the beginning of each year.) We use our 5th and 6th grade students to read the scripture readings for the day. We have a Kindergarten student come up during prayer time as our "helper". And we have classes take turns presenting the message from time to time.

The first week of April is Lutheran Schools Week and we would like to invite congregation members to join us for our chapel worship on April 2. The school has grown to the point where we take up all but 2 sections of the chairs in the sanctuary, but what would be better than a packed house of "standing room only" folks praising God with children.

### **FINANCE MINISTRY TEAM**

**\$389,575** given for the first seven months of this Fiscal year. That is an average of \$12,986 per week or \$55,653 per month.

The Fiscal Year Budget is **\$733,165**. This requires giving that averages \$14,100 per week or \$61,097 per month.

#### MORTGAGE UPDATE

Recently HTLS received a significant estate gift. The School Board has directed that \$300,000 of that gift go towards reducing our building loan balance. In addition, the Board of Directors has directed that \$45,000 of our general fund surplus also go towards reducing our building loan balance. Together, those two payments will reduce our loan balance to approximately \$265,000.

The interest rate on the loan is currently 3.75% and will remain so until a rate adjustment in April of 2027. At that time the loan balance should be about \$110,000. Interest rates will most likely be higher then, but our monthly payment should be lower because of our smaller loan balance. Thanks to everyone for their continued financial support of Holy Trinity Lutheran Church and School!






